*Time is your GREATEST Enemy!*

Students may struggle with ACT content, but they will struggle with limited time on the ACT. Figuring out where to place a comma is easy until four choices are offered, and only 36 seconds are given to make a decision. To combat this enemy, students should take a strategies course like ACT Prep offered at MCHS, or see a test prep instructor for assistance. Remember, you can do it!

**MCHS TIGER CLINIC NOTES**

Marshall County High School and the rest of the Marshall County School System are a part of the Epinephrine for Schools Program where EpiPens are provided to each school to use in the event of an anaphylactic reaction. The school nurses train all faculty and staff in each school on the use of epinephrine in an anaphylactic emergency. The availability of the rescue medication gives teachers, nurses' and administrators' reassurance that life-saving medicine is available if needed. Having EpiPens in each school in no way should keep parents and students alike from letting school nurses and administration know that they are prescribed epinephrine and what that child is allergic to. Parents should contact the school and verify the 504 and/or health plan of their students as well as provide EpiPens for their child.
